

HELEN FLEMING STONE ART SCHOLARSHIP

The *Helen Fleming Stone Art Scholarship* shall be administered, in cooperation with the Stone family, through the Georgia Art Education Association from which the interest / profits of the scholarship funds will be given annually to a graduating National Art Honor Society high school senior. Anyone can contribute funds to the scholarship.

The committee who shall select the National Art Honor Society member to receive the scholarship will consist of three Georgia Art Education Association members; namely,

1. the GAEA President (who shall serve as chairperson), the GAEA Past-President, or the GAEA Present-Elect,
2. the Higher Education Chairperson or the Higher Education Chairperson-Elect, and
3. the Chairman, or a member, of the Finance Committee.

None of the three Georgia Art Education Association committee members may be a Secondary Art Educator. In the event one or more of these is / are Secondary Art Educators, the GAEA President shall appoint suitable replacements.

The committee shall select a second-place entry in case the recipient who, for some reason, fails to qualify or meet the criteria .

Criteria for Receiving the Helen Fleming Stone Art Scholarship:

1. The student shall be a member of the National Art Honor Society who will graduate from high school in the current school year.
2. The student shall submit at the National Art Honor Society State Conference a portfolio containing **six original artworks** (no copies from any source) which are
 - a. One drawing
 - b. One color and design
 - c. One three-dimensional artwork (sculpture, ceramics, jewelry, crafts)
 - d. Three additional artworks of the applicant's choice

*NOTE—There shall be **no slides, photographs, or computer generated images of the artwork submitted in the portfolio** (original photographic art or original computer art are exempted).

3. The student shall submit
 - a. An autobiography of one page only, double-spaced (12 type) including the student's interest and involvement in the visual arts
 - b. A recommendation from his / her art teacher of no more than one page, double-spaced (12 type)
4. The student shall
 - a. Participate in the NAHS State Conference including the concluding general meeting at which the the recipient will be announced and
 - b. Attend the Awards Presentations of the Georgia Art Education Association Fall Conference at which the scholarship will be presented to the recipient
5. The student shall take a minimum of one visual art course in the college / university (a certificate of meeting, or having met this requirement must be provided).
6. The Georgia Art Education Association shall provide the Stone family an annual report of the *Helen Fleming Stone Art Scholarship*.
