2	3 Introduce YAM to students and staff with a morning announcement and proclamation!	4 Ask students to donate old towels to the art room to dry their hands.	5 Have students do a math equation to calculate how many paper towels you will save in a week, month, year...	6 Ask your school to announce YAM on the school website and newsletter.	7 Have your art club make YAM posters to put up around the school. 16	17 Announce YAM in your local newspaper and send pictures of what you have already done to celebrate.	18 Create collage color wheels with cut out colors from old magazines.	19 Bring in a class plant and talk about the benefit of plants to our environment.	20 Collect used wrapping paper from class parties and students to make collage flower gardens.	21 Get local government officials, BOE members, museums, and libraries to endorse YAM.	22
	24 Ask students to bring in old calendars and use the pictures as art prints.	25 Go on lunch duty and encourage the kids to "Eat it or give it away". You will save so much food.	26 Make "Stained Glass" vases with drink bottles, glue water, and tissue paper squares.	27 Have students bring in old clothes to make a throw pillow.	28 Send winning posters to the local newspaper for publishing.	29
